

**OFFICIAL BOARD HIGHLIGHTS  
JUNE 2018**

In the Trustees report, it was reported they did not meet in May. The only expense for the month was the scheduled loan payment of \$1,200.00 to Quarry City Savings and Loan for the building renovation/remodeling project.

The Deaconess Committee reported the alter cloths will be green from May 28 thru December 2. On All Saints Day and All Saints Sunday the cloths will be white. More bar codes from Best Choice are needed for Woodhaven. Woodhaven receives \$30.00 for each 1,000 best choice bar codes. She said currently she has less than 1,000. Please place them in the coffee can on the ledge in the Parlor. Shirley asks to please keep them coming!

In Christian Women's Fellowship, Jerry reported there was an area-wide meeting with a speaker from St. Louis.

The Membership and Evangelism Committee reported church fliers were distributed through the Chamber of Commerce. The fliers are for new people in the community and Whiteman Air Force Base.

Donna Elliott is continuing to work on training for the defibrillators. She said she has spoken to several organizations that want \$100.00 for the training, and this is much higher than she had expected. Donna said after talking with the ambulance service, they said their training would be \$35.00. Donna explained this includes certification. She currently knows of ten individuals who are interested in the training, and she will make arrangements with Noel Dougherty for the best place to hang the defibrillators.

Donna said a request to the Future Planning Committee for directional signs inside the church for those not familiar with the church layout has been submitted.

Donna said she is proud to announce through the church's recycling of aluminum cans, 658 pounds of cans were delivered. A check for \$372.54 was deposited in the Building Fund for the cans. Donna said that brings the total income from aluminum cans to \$2,476.50.

The Property Committee reported most of the outdoor work has been completed. Noel said a door had to be re-ordered because the wrong door had been sent. Noel said the stained glass windows should be in the week of June 18.

In the Minister's Report, Jerry said there are courses he is required to take every three years, including the discussion of social issues.

Jerry thanked the CWF for their help hosting a retired teachers event and all the other events held at the Christian Life Center (CLC). Jerry said he hears many positive comments about the CLC.
