

OFFICIAL BOARD HIGHLIGHTS MAY 2018

The Trustees reported two expenditures: the monthly payment to Quarry City Savings and Loan and the payment for the garage roof replacement. The Board members agreed the roof and gables look great and should now be maintenance free.

From the Deaconess Committee, Shirley Dougherty said the alter cloths will be green until December 2, except for May 27 (Trinity Sunday) and November 1 (All Saints Day). On November 2 (All Saints Sunday) the cloths will be white. Shirley reported she has received quite a few bar codes but needs more!! She said Woodhaven receives \$30 for each 1,000 Best Choice bar codes. She said to please keep them coming!!

The Membership and Evangelism Committee will make deliveries for our Carnation Ministry and prepare Coffee Fellowship this month. The three defibrillators for the church have been delivered. This committee will work with the Property Committee to decide the best location for the defibrillators in the Sanctuary, the Education Building, and the Christian Life Center. Plans are being made to set up the necessary CPR training for those that are willing to help if needed. Jerry said 4 or 5 individuals will be trained to use the defibrillators, and more people are needed.

In the Property Committee Report, Noel Dougherty reported they are happy with the work done by Brubaker Roofing. Noel reported the annual fire inspection went well except the church address was removed when the stained glass panel was removed. He said the stained glass will be replaced in a few weeks and the address will be added again. Noel said work will begin on the old kitchen outside entry. He said the door will be replaced with a metal door which will be better for security. Noel said the church needs a new phone system, but this will tie in with the security committee projects.

In the Worship Committee report, Anita Grigsby asked about having the Hand Bells perform every 5th Sunday. She also recommended notifying the congregation so they would know in advance. Everyone agreed with Anita's suggestions.

The Nursery Committee is continuing to search for replacement attendants to work in the nursery for the three high school seniors who will be graduating.

In the Memorial Committee Report it was reported the interest earned on the account at Farmers and Commercial Bank was \$.23 for March, which brings the balance to \$5,451.73. Interest earned on our account at Quarry City for the first quarter of this year was \$.47 which leaves a balance of \$756.09.

The Helping Hands Committee has been active the last few months. There have been several meetings by text and phone, and a meeting with a recipient of funds on April 20, 2018. The total disbursements are \$3444.63 since the beginning of 2018. The current value of the accounts is \$217.650.10.

In the Youth Ministry Report, the year-end party was held on the last Sunday in April. It was reported the youth and their families had a great time, and will plan a get together again.

In the Minister's Report, Jerry thanked Kathy Ramser for her work on the CROP Walk. Jerry said this project is important because the money raised will help many in our community who struggle with expenses. Jerry said he believes it would be good if each church in Warrensburg selected a school to help those in need. He said the church has four high school graduates this year: Caroline Smith, Hannah Stillwell, Joann Godfrey, and Molly Shumard. Congratulations to these four girls!!
