

OFFICIAL BOARD HIGHLIGHTS SEPTEMBER 2018

In the Elder's report, Chairman Kelley Good said Secretary Cindy Howard suggested the Elders collect and count the cash received on Sunday's due to Don Hoover's absence. Because of the need to change prior procedures, Pastor Jerry said there should be a meeting with all the Elders. There was discussion of the different options and what would be safest and most secure. Al Gosney said it would be helpful if those taking on new positions received specialized training. Noel Dougherty suggested training once the new officers are elected. There was discussion of developing policies and procedures for locking doors, lights, etc. A meeting will be arranged with the Elders.

In the Deaconess report, Shirley Dougherty said Donna Bodenhamer and Sherin Sellman will be serving during September. She asked everyone to please continue to drop off bar codes from Best Choice in the coffee can in the window of the parlor.

In the Christian Women's Fellowship report, Karen Love said the rummage sale will be held on September 6-8. She thanked everyone for their contributions, and said she appreciated the hard work of everyone putting the sale together. Karen said pillows will be made again this year for the Angel Tree Project. She said a Bible study will begin toward the end of September. Karen said all women are invited to C.W.F. The group meets the second Thursday of each month at 9:30 a.m. in the Church Parlor. Karen said there will not be a meeting in September because of the garage sale.

The Membership and Evangelism Committee reported it is preparing for their Carnation Ministry and Coffee Fellowship for the month of October. Donna Elliott reported they are finishing the requirements for the AED machines. She said the small straps will be used to secure the doors of the cabinets and the machines to prevent tampering. Donna said signs will be hung near the machines, so they are easily found by church people and emergency personnel. She said Mark Goodwin's brother will check to be sure we are compliant with State Regulations. Donna said Central Dispatch will be notified of the location of the equipment. She said the machines are currently registered for seven years.

The Membership Committee was contacted and asked to help extend the work of the CROP Walk by supplying food and hygiene items for the Food Center. Donna said if enough churches and groups participate, one church per month on Saturday would be responsible at Bi-Lo and the Dollar General Store on the south side of Warrensburg. She said this would require two people at each door of the stores from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. in one-hour shifts. Donna said at 3:00 p.m. the items would be collected and delivered to the Food Center. She said currently only two churches are participating along with some service groups. Donna said there would be no collections made in October, November, and April because of other commitments to help at the Food Center. She said there will be no collections made at Wal-Mart and it is unsure if collections will be made at Woods Grocery Store. Donna will see who is interested in helping with this project.

In the Property Committee report, Noel said the air conditioner has been repaired, along with the kitchen refrigerator and freezer, and a new thermostat has been installed in the Christian Life Center Lobby. He said due to all of these expenses, the re-sealing of the parking lot has been postponed until the Spring of 2019.

The Stewardship and Finance Committee reported a letter will be sent for the Capital Campaign. David Handy said this is separate from the regular annual pledge drive. David said money raised will be used to repay the money borrowed from the trustee's fund for construction costs.


In the Nursery Report, Donna said she is trying to make contact with some education majors at the University of Central Missouri to help as alternates in the nursery.

The Memorial Committee reported the interest earned on our account at F & C Bank for July was \$.96 bringing the balance to \$5,453.48.

The Church Security Committee reported pepper spray training has been completed and information has been obtained on glazing for ground level windows

In the Youth Ministry and the Disciples on Campus, it was reported these groups did not meet over the summer months, but they will start meetings in October.

In the Minister's Report, Jerry thanked everyone who has stepped up to fill Don's big shoes since he has been ill. Jerry reported several new members joined a few weeks ago: Sara Williams, and Bill and Vicki Goodwin. Welcome to our new members!!
